There are no trees in this landscape, called ardnut. The people of the region, who used to be known as Eskimos, call themselves tiunI. The kua family you'll meet includes Atlantic puffins, razorbill auks, black guillemots and common murre. The citcratnA is the region surrounding the South Pole. It is very cold there. You'll study four species of sniugnep: king penguins, gentoo penguins, rockhopper penguins and macaroni penguins.
