VERTIGES

Since the dawn of time, people have been striving to control time, speed it up or even stop it. But what is time, really? In this new show, the immersive setting of the Chaos Theatre becomes a fantastic playground for a skilful exploration of the philosophical, scientific and artistic aspects of time. Using fascinating images and a narrative featuring some surprising artistic performances, *Vertiges* takes us on a disconcerting voyage. Comfortably ensconced in bean-bag chairs, audiences explore the relativity of time, the absence of time and time as a sensory sound phenomenon. And suddenly, our traditional understanding of time comes undone. In *Vertiges*, Jimmy Lakatos and Alexandre Burton are more interested in asking questions than answering them. And they definitely succeed! This journey through the different facets of time shows us that despite our deep conviction that time is marching on, in fact time is just an illusion.

"In designing *Vertiges*, we started from the idea that time means something different to everyone. And it's our perspective that affects our ability to think. This is a hotly debated concept in the scientific world right now. We modelled and built an "a-temporal" universe around an esthetic and artistic experience in which time appears to be discontinuous. In close collaboration with Gervais Deschênes and Charles Bertrand, of Fly Studio, we project viewers into a dreamlike environment where they may find themselves everywhere at the same time, where they lose track of their relationship with time. With the collaboration of Stéphane Durand, we incorporated scientific concepts that question the classic definition of time. In *Vertiges*, our main intention is to encourage viewers to weigh this constant sense of urgency and to question the nature of time."

JIMMY LAKATOS, VIDEO-SCENOGRAPHER

Jimmy Lakatos is a video-scenographer, a pioneer in using video in shows and public spaces. He is a technical virtuoso, constantly seeking creative and technical challenges. He enjoys going beyond his comfort zone, where he can explore his artistic interests through bold technology, in a unique personal language. Jimmy has worked with Cirque du Soleil since 2006, and collaborates with Alexandre Burton as a member of Artificiel, a Montréal digital arts group that designs productions and installations for festivals and museum exhibitions. His unusual career path, combined with his pioneering professional achievements, has given him a unique perspective on the arts and the social impact of digital technologies.

ALEXANDRE BURTON, ELECTROACOUSTICIAN

Alexandre Burton, an artist and electroacoustician, is interested in technology as a way of revealing a new sensitivity specific to the digital world. He concentrates mainly on combining acoustic, visual and somatic phenomena. His work is regularly featured in international digital and music performances including Sonar, Ars Electronica, Transmediale and Cervantino. In addition to his work with the Artificial group, he advises other artistic and cultural organizations on integrating technology. Alexandre has a number of distinctions to his credit: first prize at the Bourges Electroacoustic Music Festival for sound-processing software called Cecilia; an honourable mention at Ars Electronica for the sound installation "condemned_bulbes"; and an award at the FILE festival, in Sao Paulo, for his POWEr project.

For *Vertiges*, Jimmy Lakatos and Alexandre Burton collaborated with Professor **Stéphane Durand**, a physicist and exceptional science communicator who writes and speaks widely on science topics and has received a number of prestigious awards and distinctions.
